This morning I locked myself out of the car like an idiot. A phone call later I was rescued. Thank you, Wifey!

Who hasn't needed to be rescued at times?

I was walking down Third Avenue one warm evening, nearly 28 years ago. An attractive woman hollered at me from across the street. She rearranged her clothes and jaywalked through traffic, just to talk with me. "You might think this is sort of strange, but could you pray for me?" she said, shifting a beer and grabbing

my hand. "It's not strange at all," I said, and asked for her name.

Right on the sidewalk, holding Lisa's rough hand, I asked God to grant wisdom and strength. She did not let go. Her hard hand clung to mine like a swimmer, out of their depth, holding onto a lifeline.

I have no illusions that things suddenly got easy for Lisa. But in that brief moment there was something solid and real, a human bond and a shared need. Because we all need rescuing. We are in this world together, to show kindness and mercy and to cling to the Really Real. And those who come behind us will learn to hang on as well. ●

"For I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate (Romans 7:15)."

The soaking rain is falling around us. And Casey's tears continue to fall. In the eyes of God, we are much more than our failures. Pray for all those seeking wholeness. ●



Behind the scenes

We get to tell some great stories about our work here. The best stories come from the front-line workers, who are face-to-face with clients. But we have faithful, behind-the-scenes workers too, and their stories are hardly ever brought to light. So here is one.

We get phone calls all day long in the Nightwatch admin office. Our Office Manager, Coleen, is the person who answers most of them. It might be someone needing shelter. Sometimes, a caller wants to volunteer. Or perhaps a donor has questions about where to drop off socks, or food, or other supplies. All day long, Coleen graciously steers them to options, to solutions, or finds answers.

Occasionally, a parent or family member will call, looking for a lost loved one. These calls are the toughest. You can hear the despair in their voices.

Not long ago, Coleen took a call from a mother in Texas. I know what she told that desperate mother. "I can't tell you if your son has been here, but we will be on the lookout for him. If we see him, we will ask him to call you."

Our Security guy that very night was Steve. He knew the missing son and watched for him in the crowd. When the young man got to the door, Steve handed him his personal cell phone and said "Call your mother."

I heard the voicemail from the mom the next day. She was overjoyed to hear from her son. She said that Coleen's help had "saved our family." She named Steve by name.

This is Nightwatch. This is what we do. Up front or behind the scenes. •
