Happy to talk with your community about collaboration!


Lord, thank you for coming to find us whenever we are lost. •

I was visiting a friend who had recently moved into transitional housing.

He showed me a picture of a cross with the four ends shaped like arrows, making it look like a compass. The drawing reminded me of an encounter that we had on the streets just a few weeks prior.

It was a bitterly cold night in a downtown

park. We came upon "John" laying down on the ground, with only a thin blanket to protect him. I knew it wouldn't be enough to keep him warm for the long, chilly night ahead. I asked him if he could use a sleeping bag. His eyes lit up and he said that would be helpful. So, I went back to the car and grabbed one.

It was his response after I handed it to him that stuck with me: "Thank you. I didn't know what I was going to do until you showed up."

The love Christ poured out for us at the cross can now be poured out of us onto others. This love is like a compass, a guiding star in the night sky for folks, like John, who may have forgotten that God loves them immensely.

Lord, thank you for being our true north. ●
