Most of the people I run into have something deep and urgent to share. It's an honor to listen.

It's okay that it rarely takes "just a minute." Big stuff takes time to process. It's also okay that it's not always coherent. Sometimes we need others to help make sense out of what we're experiencing.

"Manny" was insulted on the bus; "Cici" says her doctor doesn't listen; "Diane" is concerned about a neighbor; "Albert" is frustrated about politics; "Chrissy" wishes she could be with her son as he graduates, but she is stuck

in the sex trade; "Pete" wants a place to live, but will settle for a safe place to sleep; "Andrew" feels called to shift careers to help those in great need, but is anxious about the change.

The weight of burden is shared.

Listening brings the awareness of lots of things to pray for (and work for!) every day. It's how Operation Nightwatch abides in relationship and continues to learn and respond.

I'm reminded of the most important listening in my daily life, "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased. Listen to him." (Matthew 17:5).

"Speak Lord, your servant is listening..." (1 Sam. 3:9)

Amidst the crowd perusing local bars restaurants and art galleries downtown, a man lay on his back. A friend frantically trying to help him. At the beginning of every outreach, we pray for eyes to see people as God sees them.

We saw this man. Drawing near, we could see that his lips and face were blue and that he was not breathing. I pulled the Narcan out of my backpack as Rev. Michael called 911. After I administered Narcan he was still unresponsive, and Rev. Michael began CPR chest

compressions. Eventually the man regained consciousness just as Seattle Police Department and Seattle Fire Department arrived.

We all reminded him that he was still in mid-overdose and he agreed to go to the hospital. The first responders helped him onto the stretcher. His three friends joined us in a circle of prayer.

Afterward, Rev. Michael and I acknowledged this was the first time we had administered Narcan and CPR, and were thankful to be allowed by God to save someone's life.

I believe that it was God's work through the people of Operation Nightwatch that made it possible for us to be there that night. ●

Operation Nightwatch is unique in our approach to those that are suffering. The foundation of our work is relationships with those we encounter.

I have worked in homeless services for my entire career and other organizations do this to some extent, but we are able to be different. By seeking flexible funding sources, including our community of generous donors and private foundations, we are able to prioritize relationships over metrics.

We have authentic relationships that are

built on trust and consistency. **This trust and consistency creates a community.**Whatever brought an individual to the streets can be overcome with relationship.
Relationship with God, and community.

Our Street Ministers walking down the street and praying with those they encounter; dispatch staff making an extra sandwich for a client who showed up late because of his job and missed dinner; shelter staff sitting with a client and listening to his story of aging out of foster care and entering adulthood without parental structure and support; the administrative team making sure the bills are paid and staff has health insurance. These are all examples of the work our team does every day.
