I asked if they could tell me a bit more, and they quickly painted a grim picture. Assaults are a reality. "Sometimes," one of them said, "you need to jump from a moving car [to get free]."

Their request for safety reminded me that God desires for us to be free from trouble, too. "Where the spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom." (2 Corinthians 3:17) Also, "Come to me... And I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28)

Our new emergency women's shelter is providing a

place for our guests to find rest and safety. Among the many who have stayed for refuge, we've helped some women who were fleeing situations of domestic violence and human trafficking. They have had a chance to stabilize, connect with our case manager, and find new resources on their path to safety and freedom.

Your generosity is saving lives. Thank you for making our work possible! ●



My friend Brad thought it made sense to move out of his apartment into an RV so that he could pay down his student loans. It didn't work out.



Working with homeless people has taught me about the vulnerability of God. A God who announces his kingdom under the shadow of empire, violence, and oppression while riding atop a borrowed donkey.

As I was walking to church on Sunday morning, prepared to preach, serve communion, and pray with and for the congregation, I saw my homeless friend Steven.

He was asleep in the doorway where he usually finds rest and shelter. As I

approached, three middle school age boys pulled up on scooters. I had a bad feeling in my stomach, but didn't want to jump to conclusions. As I got closer, one young kid aggressively mocked and then assaulted my friend. I yelled, and they sped away. I bent down and asked Steven if he was ok and if he wanted a coffee. He said he was fine, and he would see me at church.

Steven did come to church. I preached on the Good Shepherd, and that God leaves the ninety-nine in search of the one, always rejoicing abundantly when we realize that we are deserving of being found.
